

SCIENCE AND ART

'The amateur service is designed primarily to facilitate hobby radiocommunications and for technical experimentation and operates on specified frequency bands. Amateur radio operators *communicate* (my emphasis) using transmission modes including, but not limited to, Morse Code, telephony and data' (ACMA, 2014).

CALL SIGNS

• A call sign is constructed as a unique identifier given to you by ACMA.

• There are no bad call-signs, just good ones and better!

• Know your call-sign, its strengths and weaknesses and know how to say it phonetically using the NATO (ACMA preferred phonetics).

HOW OFTEN SHOULD YOU IDENTIFY?


- Most amateurs identify too frequently!
- We are required to identify every ten minutes, or at the beginning and end of a contact (if less than 10 minutes).
- The ACMA regulations require a mobile or portable station to give the full location of their operations, e.g., this is VK5BJE, portable in New South Wales operating from Eurobodalla National Park.

GOOD ON-AIR MANNERS

- Listen on the frequency before transmitting.
- None of us 'own' a frequency conventions apply.
- Do not tune an antenna coupler on a frequency in use: move up or down to tune and identify.
- Unidentified transmissions are in breach of the regulations.


GOOD ON-AIR MANNERS

- Do not use inappropriate/bad or strong language.
- Do not make racist or gender-based comments.
- Do not talk about religion or politics.
- Avoid being too opinionated on topics you have not researched.


