He may have a different QSL each week as it's not the same as Paul Ormandy's one from last week. lan. *[Wonderful and well done. Great to hear from you - don't be a stranger!]*



Soon to be retired **Mike Smith in Opunake** is next. Hi Stu and Crew, Another quiet month with conditions still not great here at least. Hopefully will pick up a bit as the grey line shifts north - it's nearly Alaska time. I managed to catch an EE ID from KFOX Radio Seoul on 1650 the other night, heard on the Russell SDR, also WOKB 1680 earlier in the month. I've been experimenting with the ewe here reversing the direction to look at Asia but wasn't that good, so it's back to SSE for now. The Latins still turn up around dusk but nowhere near the levels they were during the equinox. Also had a look around shortwave on the SSE/SDR combination and have a few listings for lan's Bandwatch column. I've handed in my retirement notice to Powerco, as of October 1 my email address will be smithson45@gmail. com for all DX communications, so I'll need to get in and change the DXDialog settings. Retirement still looks pretty busy but hopefully will have time for a few DX focussed trips around the country. [I am reliably informed that you will soon wonder how you ever had time for work! Am looking forward to Alaskan season as I know a number of us are.]

Already retired **Arthur DeMaine of Ashburton** has been out and about lately and reports in with this: Just thought I would drop in and report that we had six nights at Charleston on the West Coast. No rain and quite warm apart from the day we went to Westport, very cool wind blowing down the main street. Unfortunately South American MW decided to go on holiday

and all that I heard on MW was Australian and New Zealand stations on my bamboo made 3m EWE pointing mainly South to South-West. Heard the two Pirates on 6285 and 6960 but not at good strength. Heard a number of other stations on Shortwave. On ATC frequencies I caught for the first time Colombo ATC.

From home heard the LRA36 test broadcast at 1822 UTC in English on an SDR in Brazil. Not much else to report. [Well, that is more than I have heard. The ATC (presume Air Traffic Control) from Colombo is a good catch. Well done.]

The Fireman and League Secretary, **Steven Greenyer in Timaru**, reports in that his new container home in Hinahina is making good progress. He even sent some impressive pics. The only problem is that the home isn't currently in South Otago, it is in Christchurch and he doesn't know when it will arrive on site. Paul Ormandy helpfully suggested he would lend him a wheelbarrow so that he can move it. Typical, full of bright ideas!

John Durham in Tauranga tells us: A rather quiet month with not a great deal of DX activity. Noted the sunspot count has been sitting on 2 for the last few days, maybe this is a sign of better things to come. [If DXers are anything, they are always optimistic - we hope so too!]

Bryan Clark in Mangawhai is off to destinations south shortly, but has time to send this: Confession time - another radio has been added to the shack - this time an Ocean Digital WR-828F Internet Radio purchased through AliExpress. Reception of Auckland AM and FM stations is less than optimal here - I often listen to the BBC World Service on 810 during the day but at night reception is impractical because of skywave signals from RNZ National Dunedin. So the new radio has been programmed to deliver webstream audio from BBC WS and BBC Radio 4, along with RNZ National and RNZ Concert through a micro FM transmitter to any radio around the house that I have pretuned to 102.5 FM.

I continue to monitor MW nightly for the Broadcast Trail and there are still a few interesting Latin Americans to be heard, though North Americans are increasingly taking over, and splatter from locals is always a frustration. Heading to Southland in August for a few weeks, so will take a radio along for the ride and some DX! [Is there room for another radio and does Sandy know?! I look forward to seeing it in action. Enjoy your time in the south.]

- * Northland SDR (NNE direction)
- # Opunake SDR (often SSE, but can be NNW direction)

If there's no symbol, you were using your own radio or SDR equipment, and your own aerial

KGB RETURNS TO SAN DIEGO: NEW AMERICAN 'BIN' NETWORK

NEW ZEALAND NZME's new "Gold AM" network launched on 1 July using the following AM frequencies previously used by Radio Sport :

549 Nelson, 558 Invercargill, 693 Dunedin, 702 Ashburton, 729 Whangarei, 774 New Plymouth, 792 Hamilton, 1062 Whanganui, Palmerston North 1089, Hawkes Bay 1125, Auckland 1332, Rotorua 1350, Timaru 1494, Christchurch 1503, Wellington 1503, and Tauranga 1521. (BC)

ALGERIA Since early June 2020, Alger Chaîne I on 891 is off air. The 1422 and 981 outlets continue as always. (Guillermo Sáez mediumwave.info 15/6 via IRCA)

ARGENTINA 1070 AM, previously occupied by LR1 Radio El Mundo has new owners - Radio Cooperativa, which currently operates on 770 KHz. It is not known whether Radio Cooperative will move to this new frequency under this same name, leaving the 770 KHz where it currently transmits, and if any, what will happen to the latter frequency, (Argentina en AM y FM Facebook page)

AUSTRALIA SEN Track Melbourne is now on air on **1593** kHz (ex Niche Radio Network) Melbourne, some hours earlier than announced. 3MP Melbourne **1377** kHz is now owned and operated by ACE broadcasters. The switch-over from SEN to 3MP supposedly occurred at 1800hrs LT. July 3rd, 2020. (Ian Baxter via MW Masts io Group)

ABC North Queensland has announced that the main AM Broadcast 198m high Mast situated near Brandon North Queensland, in service on **630** kHz since 1959, will be demolished and replaced with a new 236m high mast. During the work 630kHz will remain on-air, however at reduced power on backup medium wave antenna. The work is expected to start next Wednesday and be completed during November 2020. The 3 year planning stage for the replacement mast has taken into account enhancements to ensure reliability of coverage for 4QN and includes the latest enhancements in severe weather structural survivability. A number of backup temporary FM Broadcast services have been brought online. If you have trouble getting good reception on ABC 630kHz AM then try these alternative radio services - Charters Towers - 100.1MHz FM, Cardwell - 100.1MHz FM and Townsville - 91.1MHz FM. Further information can be found online at -abc.net.au/radio/northqld/important-signal-information/12443928 (WIA News 26/7 via Ray Crawford)

BRAZIL Rádio Globo closed its AM network May 31 and stations have to till the end of 2020 to migrate to other networks or establish local programming. Some stations are still using the Radio Globo identification eg 1240 Radio Globo Ituiutaba, (MG72) but with local program. (TuRadio, Rudolf Grimm and Jan Alvestad, ARC via IRCA)

CANADA (via IRCA DX Monitor, Jon Pearkins & Dan Sys IRCA)

Expect a change in overnight programming on most of the Corus-owned stations in Canada. The last live "The Shift with Drex" aired July 10, and had been easily recognizable with the host's Australian accent and his weekly simulcast with KMOX. No word yet on replacement programming. It was carried on CKNW-980 New Westminster BC, where it originated, as

well as CHNL-610 Kamloops BC, CHED-630 Edmonton AB, CHQR-770 Calgary AB, CJOB-680 Winnipeg MB, CFPL-980 London ON, CJOY-1460 Guelph ON, CHML-900 Hamilton ON and CFMJ-640 Toronto ON. All but CHNL frequently identify as "Global News".

- 810 CKJS Winnipeg MB An extension to November 30 2021 has been approved for the move to FM, but it is 3 months earlier than the station's estimated completion date. Rather than leasing space on a shorter Rogers tower, as originally approved, CKJS-FM is now approved to operate on their own land with less power on a taller tower. All of that coupled with the usual three month AM-FM simulcast period, means that CKJS-810 should be available for two more DX seasons.
- 1570 CJLV Laval QC Applied to amend license to increase Ethnic programming to 40% from the standard 15% allowed on AM stations, with programming blocks for Spanish, Arabic (Maghrebi), Greek and Chinese (Mandarin) audiences in the Montreal area. The existing, but not profitable, local French language programming for Laval would continue for the remaining 60% of the broadcast week.

GUAM KUSG Agaña on **1350** has been granted an STA (special temporary authority) to operate U1 with 75 watts day and night, due to grounding issues. (NRC DX News)

ISRAEL Our man on the spot in northern Israel confirms that the 10 kW transmitter on **1458** kHz at She'ar Yashuv, which used to carry Reshet Alef or KAN TARBUT (Culture Network), has now been reactivated, but with a different channel, KAN MORESHET (Heritage Network). It is \\ with 100.7 MHz (Haifa) and 90.8 MHz (Kohav Hayarden).

The primary target is the far northern town of Kiryat Shmona, as well as the settlements on the Golan Heights that the FM signals do not reach. (Ray Robinson, Voice of Hope via WRTH Monitor 6/20 via Glenn Hauser's WOR io Group)

LUXEMBOURG RTL on **234** longwave is considering closing their transmitter this year. This would leave Luxembourg, France and Belgium without any nationwide French speaking AM service. (Bretagne 1593 kHz the only regional). (Ydun's Medium Wave Info 2.6.2020 via Arctic Radio Club via GH's WOR io Group) These rumours have been going on since Europe1 closed its longwave transmitter. But the station has never confirmed any of these. However, the station seems to go on reduced power every evening. This has been going on for months. At 1820 UTC (1920 UTC in the winter) ±2 minutes there is a break in transmission of about 5 seconds. Then the signal comes back with lower power. (Rémy Friess via Mike Terry via WOR io Group)

MEXICO According to San Diego radio news: https://www.themightier1090.com/news **1090** XEPRS going back to sports by early August. (Bill Lipis via Phil Bytheway, IRCA)

The FCC's International Bureau (has) dismissed an application to deliver Mandarin Chinese programming from a studio located in Irwindale, California to XEWW-AM **690** in Mexico for rebroadcast back into the United States. The application was dismissed because the parties failed to include in their application a key participant, Phoenix Radio, which produces the Mandarin programming in its studio. Phoenix Radio is partially owned by two entities with Chinese government ownership, Extra Steps Investment Limited and China Wise International Limited. The parties have 48 hours to cease broadcast operations related to this application. The intent of the application was that the programming would be transmitted from the studio to XEWW-AM in Rosarito, Baja California Norte, Mexico and then broadcast back into the United States. If such a revised application is filed that includes Phoenix Radio as an applicant, the Commission would review it under applicable law, including determining whether the grant of the application would serve the public interest under Section 309 of the Communications Act. (Steve Whitt MW Circle via Nick Hall-Patch in IRCA io Group:

XEWW 690 is running announcements re their Chinese programming pending FCC objections/filings. So 690 is simply running music fill and announcements to go to a website for the former Chinese programming. (IRCA)

NORFOLK ISLAND Per their website, Radio Norfolk now broadcasts on **1566** AM at the following times: Monday to Friday 7am till 4pm, then relay of Radio NZ, Saturday 7am to 12pm, then relay of Radio NZ; Sunday 7am to 11am, then Radio NZ.[Times listed here will be local – 1 hour behind NZ. I did hear them opening at 2000 UTC last year but haven't been able to trace their signal during my late July checks morning and evening. (BC)

PORTUGAL I confirm the channel of the Radio Renascença group called "Rádio Sim" is theoretically over. The MW transmitters airing Radio Sim were switched to air Radio Renascença channel 1 instead, with the Seixal transmitter awaiting reactivation. The active MW frequencies will be 891 Vilamoura, 963 Seixal (greater Lisbon), 981 Geria (Coimbra) and 1251kHz Castelo Branco. There are no plans to reactivate the remaining MF transmitters, let alone that of the Muge site which houses 2x10 kW MW transmitters, 1x100 kW MW transmitter plus 1x100 kW HF transmitter. UNITED KINGDOM Radio stations will be allowed to continue broadcasting via analogue for another decade, the government has said, after several FM and AM commercial radio licences were set to expire from early 2022. Under new government plans, Ofcom will be able to renew analogue licences for a further 10-year period so long as stations also broadcast on digital radio. Nearly 60 per cent of all radio listening is now via digital devices, but analogue stations are still used by millions of listeners on FM and AM radio services every day, according to the Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS). John Whittingdale, the minister for media and data, said the extension was agreed to ensure there is "no disruption" for listeners over the next decade. A public consultation on extending

analog commercial radio broadcasting licences, which ran from December 2019 to February 2020, originally proposed either a five-year or eight-year extension. Licences for a number of stations, including popular broadcasters such as Classic FM and TalkSport, were due to expire in the next few years. The government's consultation came in light of a shift to digital listening across the UK, with current trends suggesting analogue radio could account for only 10 per cent of listening by the end of this decade. KNX, Los Angeles — A Centenníal Station The station will celebrate its 100th anniversary on Sept. 10.

How many of you have KNX, 1070 as your first American MW verification? I know that Paul Ormandy and I do. Here is an interesting article on its history.

In 1920, Fred Christian left his employment as a Marconi shipboard radio operator to become the manager of the Electric Lighting Supply Co. in Los Angeles. In addition to selling lighting fixtures, he began to offer the radio parts that tinkerers needed to build their own homemade radio sets.

From a back bedroom of his home, Christian also operated his 5 W amateur radio station, 6ADZ. On or about Sept. 10, 1920, he began broadcasting phonograph records borrowed from a local record store. Music transmission was not prohibited by amateur operators at that time, and dozens of hams around the country were broadcasting on informal schedules.

Christian, operating at the bottom of the ham bands on 200 meters (1500 kHz), was only the second radio station to broadcast in Los Angeles to that time. His aim was to promote the sale of radio parts in his store by giving his customers something to listen to.

In 1920, there were still no fixed regulations governing broadcasting, and the first stations operated under a variety of license classes, such as amateur, experimental or "commercial land station." (The renowned pioneer station KDKA debuted with a new category called "limited commercial" license under the call sign 8ZZ.)

But starting in December 1921, the Department of Commerce required all stations broadcasting news or entertainment to hold a "Limited Commercial" license, and so most of the handful of stations already broadcasting by that date obtained new licenses with new call signs.

By March of 1922, there were 66 such licenses issued. Regrettably, they were all required to transmit their programs on one of just two frequencies: 360 meters (833 kHz) for entertainment, or 485 meters (619 kHz) for market and weather reports.

Thus, Christian's station 6ADZ acquired the call sign KGC, and it was now sharing a single frequency with about eight other broadcasters in the Los Angeles Basin. Those stations met periodically to agree on a shared operating schedule, and KGC was only able to operate a few hours a week.

In May of 1922, Christian made arrangements to broadcast live music from the California Theatre, a prominent silent movie house. He built a new 50 W transmitter (soon increased to 100 watts), and moved his entire operation into the theatre. The move necessitated a change in operating license, and he was assigned the new call sign, KNX, with the old KGC license being deleted shortly afterwards.

Christian's was one of several stations that changed licenses that year, considered by the government then to simply be the transfer of a station from one license class to the other without an interruption in service. Both licenses were in the name of the Electric Lighting Supply Co., and Fred Christian was listed as the station manager and operator in both instances.

Calling itself "The California Theatre Radiophone," KNX was now broadcasting live music four or five days a week, featuring Carli Elinor's California Theatre Concert Orchestra and the music of the theatre's organ. A nightly newscast was also featured.

But finances to support the station were limited; advertising was not yet condoned on broadcast stations, and so the entire operation was being supported by the sale of radio parts at the store.

"The Voice of Hollywood"

In October 1924, Christian sold KNX to Guy C. Earle, publisher of the Los Angeles Evening Express newspaper, who had the means to turn it into a first-class operation. Starting in 1923, stations that agreed to transmit with at least 500 watts and abstain from playing recordings were eligible for the new Class "B" license and their own dedicated frequency, so Earle bought a new Western Electric transmitter and moved KNX to 890 kHz.

KNX was now "The Voice of Hollywood" — on the air from morning to late night with sports, news, informational talks, drama by the "KNX Players" and live evening broadcasts by Abe Lyman's Orchestra from the Hotel Ambassador.

Earle hired Carrie Preston Rittimeister to be his program director. She had experimented with paid programs at another Los Angeles station, and soon had KNX on a paying basis five nights each week.

The sponsors were local companies seeking name recognition, and there was a minimum of direct advertising in the programs themselves. By 1925, KNX was showing an operating profit of \$25,000.

In 1929, Earle signed a five-year contract with Paramount Pictures, moving the KNX studios onto the Paramount movie lot. KNX was now the "Paramount-Express" station. Taking advantage of its Paramount connections, KNX became the first station to broadcast the Academy Awards in 1930.

In 1929, KNX was awarded 1050 kHz, one of two new clear channels the Federal Radio Commission had assigned to Southern California. A new 5,000 W transmitter plant was erected in Sherman Oaks in the San Fernando Valley, and a star-studded 24-hour dedicatory program was planned for Nov. 11, at which time KNX would debut its new powerful signal for the first time.

When the dramatic moment came to switch over to the new transmitter, radio listeners heard only a tremendous screech on the new frequency, and then ... silence! After a few moments, the old 1 kW transmitter was coaxed back onto the air.

It was several days before the engineers could sort out the problem and settle KNX into its new channel. Then they discovered another problem: The new 5,000 W signal was not being reaching out as well as the old signal.

Consulting engineers were brought in from across the country to puzzle over the case, and they eventually determined that the fault was in the antenna, a 179-foot wire cage suspended between two 250-foot supporting towers. The towers were resonating at the 1050 frequency, disrupting coverage. The problem was ultimately solved by inserting porcelain insulators at

the base of the towers.

Guy Earle soon sold his interests in the Evening Express newspaper and devoted all of his energies to KNX, now operating as the Western Broadcasting Co. One of California's renowned engineers, Kenneth Ormiston, went to work planning to increase power on the clear channel frequency — to 10,000 watts in 1932, to 25,000 in 1933 and finally to 50,000 watts in 1934. In all cases, the 1929 Western Electric 5,000-watt transmitter was used as a driver for the high-powered amplifiers built by Ormiston.

After WLW in Cincinnati was allowed to operate experimentally at 500 kW, plans were drawn up for a further increase to 250 kW, but the idea was abandoned in favor of a new half-wave self-supporting tower, constructed in 1935, which greatly increased signal strength at a fraction of the cost of a huge transmitter.

In 1935, Guy Earle bought the 20,000 square foot Motion Picture Hall of Fame building at 5939 Sunset Boulevard in Hollywood, and rebuilt it into the new KNX studio building at a cost of 250,000. It featured six studios suspended on floating floors. Studio "A" was 30 x 60 feet, and Studio "B" featured a new 35,000 Morton organ. Brand new RCA studio equipment was installed throughout.

Enter CBS

KNX was now a powerhouse station, with a powerful signal covering eleven Western states a night. Its 1935 gross income of \$675,000 ranked it among the six highest-billing stations in the country.

But the FCC became aware that much of that revenue was coming from the advertising of patent medicines, which the commission was seeking to eliminate from the airwaves. It decided to make KNX into a test case, and it set its license renewal for hearing over its advertisement of Marmola, a miracle fat-reducing product that the Federal Trade Commission determined to be ineffective and dangerous.

The hearing in October 1935 did not go well, and the KNX license was now in serious jeopardy. In 1936, under pressure over the license hearings, Earle sold KNX to the CBS network for \$1.25 million. It was the highest price ever paid for a single radio station to that date.

KNX was now CBS's key station on the West Coast, and would soon become the home base for CBS's Hollywood program origination.

In January 1937, CBS moved its Los Angeles network affiliation to KNX from KHJ and the Don Lee network, which caused a major realignment of network affiliations up and down the West Coast. Then on April 30, 1938, KNX and CBS moved into its new \$1.75 million Columbia Square studio complex at 6121 Sunset Boulevard.

It would be the origination location for dozens of CBS radio shows heard nationwide over the next decade, featuring stars such as Jack Benny, Bing Crosby, Burns and Allen. (KMPC then moved into the former KNX Sunset Boulevard building.)

In September, 1938, CBS debuted a new KNX transmitter complex on a five-acre parcel in Torrance. A gleaming new RCA 50-D transmitter was showcased in a streamlined domed

building that was open to the public for regular tours. A new 500-foot guyed tower propelled the KNX signal across all of the Western states in the evening hours. In March 1941, KNX moved to its present frequency of 1070 kHz after the nationwide NARBA treaty adjustment.

As network radio transitioned to the disc jockey era of the 1950s, KNX adopted a middle-of-the-road format, featuring personalities like Steve Allen and Bob Crane, who broadcast his popular KNX morning show from 1957 to 1965 before leaving to become the star of the TV series "Hogan's Heroes."

In September 1965, vandals cut a guy wire, destroying the KNX tower. The station operated from a 365-foot unused tower acquired from KFAC until a new antenna could be built. An experiment using both antennas as a directional array during the 1960s was abandoned, but both towers still exist today.

The 365-foot tower is now the KNX standby antenna, located inside a city park in Torrance.

In April 1968, KNX adopted an all-news format, which has successfully maintained it as one of the top ten news stations in the country. Entercom Communications acquired KNX in 2017 when it merged with CBS Radio. KNX will celebrate its 100th anniversary on Sept. 10, 2020.

Welcome to the August SDR News and DX pages. We begin with an interesting item from **Chris Mackerel (Marahau)** on his monitoring of All India Radio's DRM transmissions from Bengaluru as reported in the League's DX Dialog forum.

All India Radio have fired up their Bengaluru 500kW (185kW in DRM I think) transmitter again after a COVID lockdown and were running some DRM tests between 1000 & 1100 UTC tonight (July 24) so I thought I'd do a check of Marahau v Opunake v Russell SDR's:

1000-1010 UTC 15410 kHz

At home in Marahau: zilch - not a trace; Opunake Kiwi SDR: zilch - not a trace; Russell Kiwi SDR: 5% audio decoded

1015-1025 UTC 15030 kHz

At home in Marahau: zilch - not a trace; Opunake Kiwi SDR: faint DRM trace on spectrum but no decoding; Russell Kiwi SDR: 90% audio decoded on both channels

1030-1040 UTC 7550 kHz

Blocked by a strong STANAG signal here. DRM signal visible on the Russell Kiwi, but no decoding possible and no traces seen elsewhere. All transmissions appeared to be the same format: Ch1 - GOS-I, EEP, Audio 10.48 kbps; Ch2 - Vividh Bharati, EEP, Audio 10.48 kbps. For these tests the Russell site won hands-down. I still don't think AIR knows what they are doing. The 15410 test was supposedly aimed at Aus/NZ, and the 15030 at North Asia. And which one decoded best?! (Though "best" is relative!)

Next up we hear from **Douglas Johns** who writes:

I noted earlier this month that the sdr located in Bjargtangar Iceland provided quite good reception of New England seaboard stations down as far as New York around our local dusk time and also the odd high powered Canadians in Toronto etc. were quite strong. Prior to that say around 3pm local Iberian Peninsula stations abounded. Even a couple of QSLs have rolled in - both by email - from earlier reports being WUPE 1110 and WPNH 1300, both heard on a Shrewsbury VT SDR. (Hi Douglas. I use the Bjargtangar sdr quite a lot and have had some excellent logs and QSL's from this sdr. Ed.)

Now a few comments from **Ken Baird, Wainuiomata**. Ken comments: After your comments the other day I have been checking the Twente SDR using my Win10 PC and Edge+ and notice regular drop-outs since the change from 500 users to 800 users. Also, I have been getting a strong signal indication from the Spectrum display on the Twente SDR, but no audio on tuning the freq. An immediate check on Fenu-Radio in Switzerland, on the same frequency gave a strong signal with good audio - a bit strange. I think the Twente has a problem and I tend not to use it now. (Ken I still use the Twente SDR although I also not it often suffers from audio drop outs. Ed) Ken also comments: I get the regular data on loggings from HCDX. I notice they accept loggings from any receiver, including out of the

correspondents country SDRs. Glen Hauser will use any SDR to get the station he is after. Also, I saw a comment on ZDnet, a top tech Internet site, that a major change to the Internet will be announced on 28 July. No details given. This could be worth checking at the end of the month. Sounds very major. (Very interesting Ken. I wonder what this development may be. Ed) Ken further comments: I was browsing around and came across the "Spy Server Network". Search for SDR# (SDRSharp). Download the Community Package (It has all the plugins). Open SDR#, and source Spy Server Network. You will see a URL, to the right are 3 dots. Click on these and a list of SDRs available on the web show up as well as a map. Away you go. A different group of SDR's. (Tnx for all that info Ken. Sorry you couldn't hear the LRA36 15476 broadcast. The best sdr to hear this one on is the Pardinho sdr in Brazil. I logged it on the 4/7 at 1359 UTC s/on to after 1500 UTC. Signal began as fair but became much better after 1430 UTC.)

105.7 FM WILL BE THE NEW HOME FOR COAST IN CANTERBURY

From Monday August 3rd you'll be able to hear Coast across Cant...

David Kaio checks in with a pending change in Christchurch. It looks as though C105.7 is on its way out to be replaced by Coast who are currently on 1593 and 90.1. Opening date is Monday 3rd August. David adds that there is nothing to indicate the future of Coast's existing Christchurch frequencies. David also enlightens us on the legality of the 105.7 frequency. It is currently registered to Pulzar Broadcasting Company Ltd and is subject to a Transitional FM Spectrum Licence Agreement between the Crown and the licensee. The legalise attached to the agreement means that the licence cannot be sold, transferred or other conditions altered without the permission of Ministry of Business, Innovation and Employment. The current licence is paid up to August 2020. 105.7 is currently registered as being at Huntsbury Hill which is to the left of Sugarloaf. Marley's Hill the other transmitting site is to the right.

What is Lightning Scatter DX?

by Bruce Atchison (VE6XTC)

Believe it or not, it's possible to receive distant FM stations during a thunderstorm. While lightning makes it difficult to hear AM and shortwave broadcasts, its crackles aren't as evident on the 88 MHz to 108 MHz band.

When lightning strikes, it temporarily ionizes the air around it. Radio signals are reflected by the charged gasses and come back down to earth.

From my experience with this kind of DX, the signal became noticeably stronger during lightning strikes. This effect lasted for a second, then the signal level dropped to its former strength.

While a thunderstorm raged overhead on July 7th, I used my CC Skywave SSB radio to check out the FM band. Instead of hearing E-skip as I had hoped, I found that tropo-like conditions reflected stations down to my home. I heard signals from a hundred miles away or further.

As just one example, I found a low-power station with the call letters CKSS on 88.1MHZ. They call themselves 88.1 The One. Find out more about this station at the http://www.881theone. ca/ link. It's located in the town of Stony Plain, Alberta. This station plays country music and airs local news events.

At a guess, I'd say the transmitter is about 120 miles from my QTH in Radway. It normally doesn't come in at all. The signal strength varied too, showing that it wasn't a local.

In my instance of catching CKSS's signal, a form of tropo ducting was also present. Rain can produce reflections of signals but it's much more pronounced in the UHF and microwave bands.

When a thunderstorm is ruining AM and shortwave reception, try DXing the FM band. You'll be surprised at what occasionally comes in.

The foregoing is not without risk of course and one should exercise care.

Meteor Scatter

A safer form of DX is via meteor scatter, ionised particles given off by meteors that burn up in the atmosphere about 100km up. Distances of around 2000km can be covered. The lower VHF frequencies are more likely to produce results but DX is also possible on the FM band. Analogue FM radio safe for 10 more years:

Meanwhile, in the UK the future of analogue FM radio is secure for another 10 years, under the latest UK Government's broadcasting plan OFCOM will be permitted to renew analogue licences provided the station also provides a digital option. According to the UK's Department for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) nearly 60% of listening is via digital. (www. independent.co.uk)
