Fact Sheet No. 6: FEEDING ZEBRA FINCHES

Zebra Finches require a simple diet of mixed seed containing Panicum Millet, White Millet, Japanese Millet and Canary Seed. These seeds can be bought already mixed from seed merchants and is called *Finch Mix*.

Feeding stations in the aviary should be checked every day and have old husks removed from the seed and top up the stations with new seed.

Zebra Finches also need greenfood for good health. Suitable foods include Silverbeet, Cabbage, Dandelion leaves and Chickweed. You can offer the birds grated Carrots, Turnips and Swedes. They will take a little time before they will accept some of these foods but with a bit of patience they will begin to eat them.

Grit is very important for all seed eating birds as it is used by the birds to grind the seed in their gizzards so they must have grit to digest their food.

Cuttlefish should be placed in the aviary at all times for the essential minerals needed for breeding birds.

Water should be replenished everyday, as the birds will bathe in the water dishes. Bathing is important for Zebra Finches to help keep feathers clean and in good condition but this habit causes drinking stations to become dirty and empty very quickly.

Following these few basic steps should help for happy Zebra Finch keeping.
