## Welcome



Hi all, and welcome to Issue 16, February 2016, of *'Out and About in VK5'*, which is dedicated to all things SOTA, Parks, portable operation, QRP, pedestrian mobile, mobile, etc from a VK5 perspective.

The month of January saw quite a bit of activity out in the field. Although, very hot weather forced the cancellation of the weekly Friday VK5 Parks event on a few occasions. We have experienced some very hot weather here in VK5 during December and January. And yet, as I type this, it is pouring with rain outside here in the Adelaide Hills. All as a result of the tropical cyclone in Western Australia.

On a personal level during January, I undertook a couple of SOTA activations at Mount Lofty and Mount Gawler, and a handful of park activations. I also enjoyed some time away with

my family at Swan Hill, and deliberately left the radio gear at home. But I did slip in some contacts from the vehicle.

As many of you would know, I also accepted a position as a Director on the WIA Board. At this stage, I will be there until the AGM in May on Norfolk Island. I have also submitted a nomination form for the WIA elections, as a Director after that time. Sadly, there is quite a bit of negativity floating around at the moment regarding the WIA. I would like to see that turned around in due course.

I will be attending the WIA AGM on Norfolk Island VKFF-0392, in May, and will be operating from Norfolk Island, hopefully as VK9PAS (I am awaiting confirmation on the call). I hope to undertake some VKFF & SOTA activations from Norfolk Isl.

During January, devastating bushfires swept across Western Australia, Victoria, and Tasmania. I remind everyone of the dangers of going out into the bush on days of extreme weather. I would strongly discourage this.

January also saw the tragic death of a bushwalker in one of the Adelaide Hills most popular Conservation Parks. This is also a poignant reminder of the danger of the Australian bush.

Close in propagation has not really improved, with some very challenging conditions for SOTA & Parks Activators and Chasers/Hunters, particularly during the morning. During the late afternoon and evenings, conditions certainly seem to be a lot better.

And long path propagation into Europe on 20m continues to be quite a challenge whilst out portable. But, for the first time in a long time, I was able to work some European park hunters on 20m. Lets hope it is a sign of things to come.

The real pleasing sign through for January was 28mhz. The 10m band has been percolating along very nicely with some very good openings for the SOTA activators and chasers. I've experienced some very strong signals from the VK1 and VK2 SOTA activators here into the Adelaide Hills. I have to get a 10m portable antenna together!

I've also been having a lot of fun on 15m. Rob VK4FFAB was my inspiration for trying this band whilst out portable. Often, the VK4 Foundation operators can't make the contact on

40m, but 15m seems to work very well. So, why not give bands other than 40m or 20m a go next time you are out portable.

Despite many pleas, I still get very few VK5 contributors to the newsletter. I know that there are a lot of people that read 'Out and About in VK5', but for whatever reason, it is like pulling teeth, to get VK5 amateurs to contribute.

## The issue of alerting and spotting again

Recently a relatively new park activator went out into the field, and failed to get a contact for the activation. Although this appears to have been a combination of a number of factors, the issue of the amateur failing to place an alert before heading out, appears to have dramatically influenced the outcome of the activation.

The message here is.....as an Activator, place an ALERT before heading out.

Advertise the fact that you are going to be out & about in as many forums as possible.

Where and how do you do that? Here are a few ideas.....

- SOTAWatch
- Parksnparks
- SOTA & Parks Yahoo groups

- Facebook
- Email
- SMS messages
- Local repeater

With regards to alerting, don't worry if you are late to the summit or the park. Or early for that matter. You can always edit the alert yourself if you have internet coverage. But don't worry if you can't access the internet to change the alert. If the SOTA chasers or park hunters really want that summit or park bad enough, they will wait for you.

There has been a multitude of posts on the SOTA Yahoo group over the years regarding the subject of alerting. Many chasers have aired their disappointment about not working an activator, because they didn't know that the activators was going to be there.

So, place an ALERT. Let everyone know that you are going to be out in the field. You will increase the number of hams in your log by doing so.

And for the SOTA chasers and Park hunters..... PLEASE place a spot if you've worked an activator, or place a post up on Facebook. Not only will the activator appreciate your efforts, but so will your fellow chasers/hunters.

The parksnparks website, created by Allen VK3HRA, will throw out a goat bleating once a SOTA activator has been spotted, and a kookaburra laughing when a park activator is spotted. If you spot a park activator, the parksnparks system will also send the spot to the international DX Cluster.

On a personal level, I've found that a single spot on the DX Cluster has resulted in a large pile up.

Many hunters and chasers are also taking full advantage of the various Facebook sites. Not just the dedicated SOTA and Park Facebook sites, but also sites such as Amateur (HAM) Radio Australia, and Amateur Radio Operators.

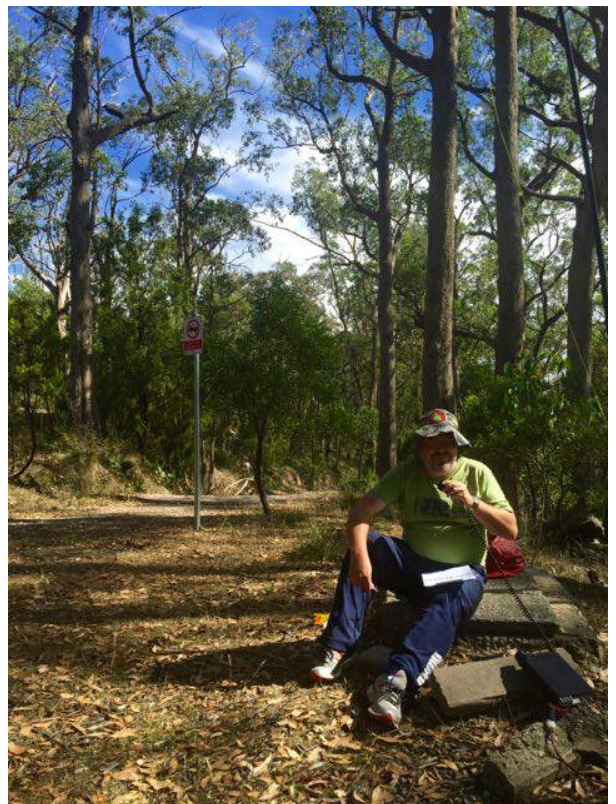

Now, this has upset one or two VK's. They. But lets remember, that WWFF is a global program.

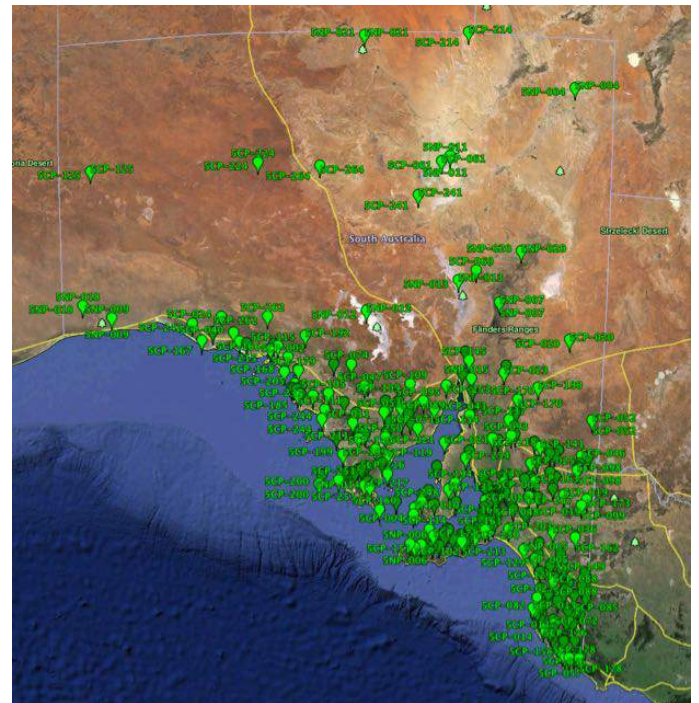
## KML file with all VK5 Parks

## Fire restrictions in SA Parks

Greg VK5GJ dropped me an email with a copy of the South Australian Government Gazette dated 29 October 2015 which has an entry

which relates to fire restrictions for parks in South Australia.

I have read the Gazette reference, which is 4 pages long. Schedule 1 specifically refers to fire restrictions in parks in Country Fire Service Fire Ban Districts. The purpose of these fire restrictions is to ensure the safety of visitors using the parks and reserves, and in the interests of protecting the Reserves and neighbouring properties.

**PLEASE ensure that prior to entering into a park, you are full conversant with what you can and cannot do.**

For example, with parks in the Mount Lofty Ranges, all wood fires or solid fuel fires are prohibited throughout the year. Gas fires or liquid fuel fires are permitted in designated areas only, other than on days of total fire ban. In the Belair National Park, designated fixed gas barbecues may be used on days of total fire ban other than when the Director has formally closed the Reserve in accordance with Regulations.

The flags are \$17.00 each (depends on how many we order). Plus a small charge for me to post out the flag/s to you, or you can collect them from me.

The flags are made by 'Australian Flag Makers' and are made from 200D knitted polyester, designed for outdoor use. The flags are single

sided, with 2 grommets so you can attach the flag to a squid pole. The flags are 40cm X 60cm in size.

So, PLEASE, send me an email.

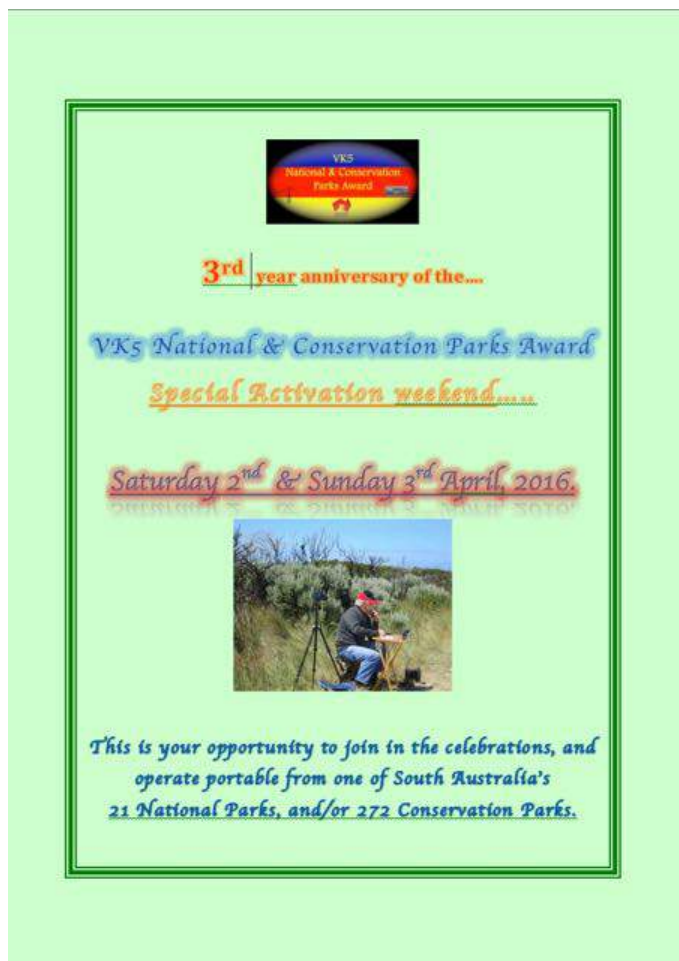

# Mount Gawler 2016

Mount Gawler vk5/se-013 is my first activation for 2016.

The weather was nice and cool and the Tour Down Under cycle race started today so I decided to activate a summit on the way to watch the Women's race go by at Mount Torrens in the Adelaide Hills.



Parked nearby the set up area the bush is slowly recovering from a bush fire in 2015 easy summit to access .



Lots of burnt out trees in woods and forest country across the road and still very dry from months of no rain this summer .

So once set up I was glad to start out with a S2S, VK1VIC/2 was very clear and strong on 40m ssb so I knew it was going to be ok to qualify the summit and as it turned out I got 3 qso's from the same summit with VK1VIC/2 , VK1FAJW/2 and VK4JAZ/2 so 3 S2S QSO's right from get go. Unfortunately no short skip to VK5 again with only a very low signal qso with Ian VK5IS on cw and VK5AO Mait who was just below me in Adelaide, luckily the vk 2 3 and 4 stations were quite strong on 40m cw.





On this summits it is hard to set the antenna up under the trees and I could only run out the dipoles north south direction which would later make it harder to qso to Japan on 15m . The wx was a nice breeze to keep cool but not really fill out the flags all the time.

Once roll over came I went on 40m ssb and made some qso's mostly with the same chasers I had worked on cw giving them some extra points but with conditions poor for the locals I could not complete a couple qso's I am sorry.



The Large tree over the fence only allowed me to put the dipole up end on to Japan which

probably did not help my signal but with the FT 857 I was running 25 watts on cw . I noticed the internal noise in the 857 is not as quiet as the kx3 and the DSP filtering was turned off helping improved my reception when working hard to pull out the weak signals. No man made noise was evident and 15m was very quiet but with low signals and qsb we had to repeat reports several times and keep listening for the qsb to go up. With this type of conditions it is good practice to slow the cw speed down and just send the RST three or four times no other information/chatter. JJ1SWI/1 Go was on summit JA/KN-020 in Kanagawa and he had the best signal considering conditions, then Mot JP1QEC/1 who was portable in a park was workable as well. Mot is my friend on Face book and I have chased him on summits before from my home, so we were proving the possibility of a s2s one day. I was very pleased NS7P Phil was able to make contact with me, its been a while since I heard from him.



This SOTA station was a FT 857 running 25 watts on ssb and cw the antennas are my newly made 40/20m and 30m/15m link dipoles fed with rg 174 feed line and in this case both



inverted V's were up 7 metres . New wire is from SOTA beams which I think is great antenna wire, the link dipoles are made up from the dipole design on sota maps.org page which has a great antenna design feature. Even down to the length of the support strings needed for my set up with a 8m squid pole and keeping with the 60 deg angle of the inverted V. The software calculates for you the length of wires needed to get the two bands you are aiming for, the length of cord needed for end supports and I call my tent pegs .1m . Very little tuning is needed to get it resonate in the area I want to operate in if you follow the design plan.

### Beaches On The Air

Amateur radio from the beach

Rob VK4FFAB recently posted on the VKFF & SOTA Facebook site about Beaches on the Air (BOTA).

Beaches on the Air (BOTA) is an award scheme for radio amateurs and shortwave listeners that encourages portable operation from beaches.

There are awards for activators (those who operate from the beaches) and chasers (those who contact activators from home or elsewhere).

BOTA can be operated from any country or region across the world. Each country or region has its own manager, who prepares the list of recognised beaches within that country or region, which is approved by the central BOTA management team.

At this stage, the list shows that there are 30 participating countries, including Australia.

Activators and chasers accumulate points with each QSO. Their total score is calculated by adding the square root of the number of QSOs made from each different beach (activators) or with each different beach (chasers).

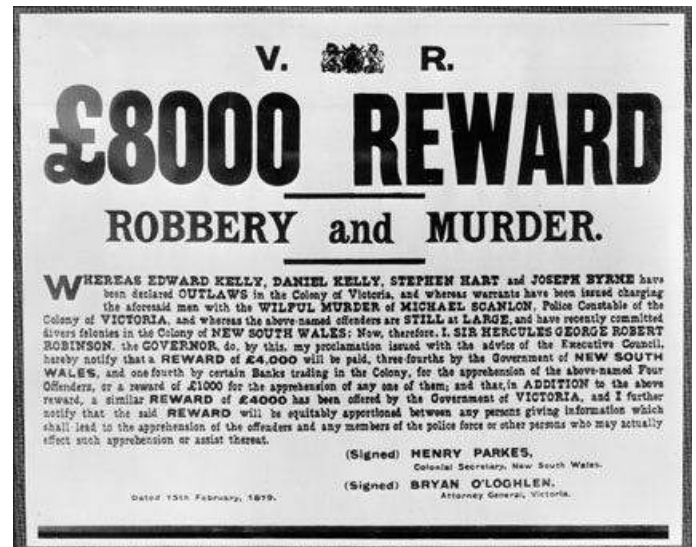
Activators can activate, and chasers can chase, the same beach as many times as they wish and they will always earn additional points, but there will be decreasing returns to activating the same beach due to the square-root rule, which encourages the exploration of new beaches. Certificates are available for various scores, both for activators and chasers.

## Self spotting

Although self spotting is tolerated on parksnparks and the SOTAWatch for SOTA & park activators, it is not recommended that you ‘self spot’ on the DX Cluster.

There is a Code of Conduct for the DX Cluster, which in dot point 5 states:

*“It is impolite to self spot (spot your own callsign) unless you are desperately trying to start activity on an open but quiet band – and even then it is preferable to spot a real DX station with a comment to the effect that the band is open”.*

## Mark Oliphant Conservation Park, VKFF-0782, 15<sup>th</sup> January 2016.

Over the last two years VK5PAS, Paul, the originator of the SANCPA award program, has established a tradition of Friday late afternoon or early evening activations of South Australian National and Conservation Parks for the award. This award encourages portable amateur radio operations from South Australian Parks. It has become quite popular and a number of portable operators in the state make the effort to set up in a Park and lots of South Australian chasers and even more from interstate reward the activators with contacts. From the point of view of the portable operators, the activity develops planning skills, navigation techniques, introduces them to SA's great parks as well as developing amateur radio skills associated with

setting up a satisfactory low-power station and using battery power. Of course the activity develops operating skills, on-going learning of communication techniques, which not only benefit the individual, but perhaps may be useful to community organisations or help with developing a career.

For me, it is just fun. I have always enjoyed portable operations. So I decided to return to the **Mark Oliphant Conservation Park, VKFF-0782**, for the fifth time. I was keen not only to assist chasers obtain this park but also to gain a score of 44 contacts to qualify this Park for the WWFF award. I always enjoy hearing from the operator at the other end say ‘this is a new Park for me’. On Friday evening I secured 38 contacts, including three duplicates, my overall cumulative score more than reaching the required 44. Here is a link to my previous activation:

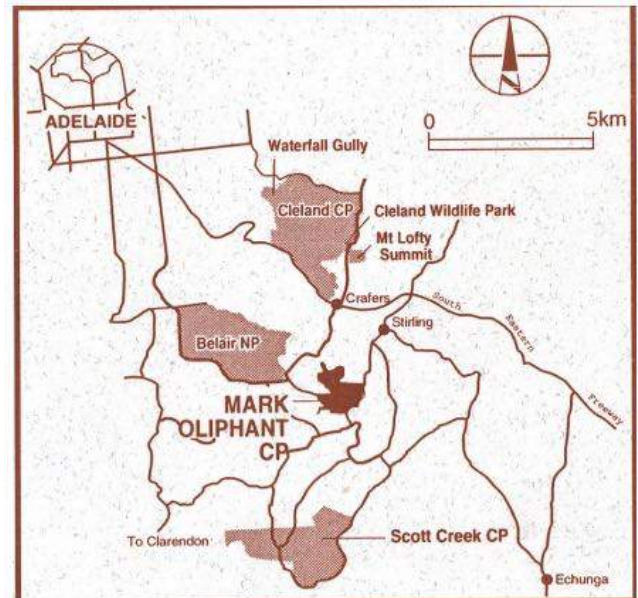

## The Park

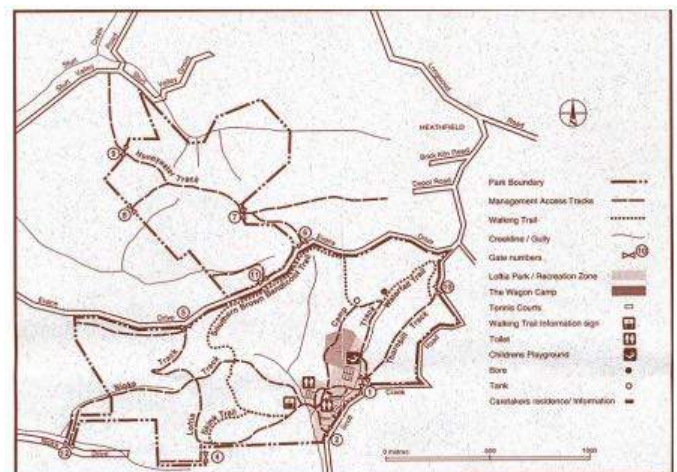
I was pleased to be able to briefly discuss the symbolism of operating from this Park, with one of my contacts. The Park is named after a very prominent Australian scientist, who was also a conservationist and a past Governor of South Australia. Of course Sir Mark was interested in radiation, from nuclear energy, slightly different to the electro-magnetic radiation we play with! He also invented the Magnetron.

In my post of 11th December 2015 I included a photo of the plaque with the citation to Sir Mark. The operator told me he had read my

earlier post and had noted the detail about Sir Mark.



This map, taken from a Park Guide shows the location of the Park in relation to **Belair National Park, Cleland Conservation Park and Scott Creek Conservation Park**. The brochure indicates that the ‘main function is to conserve an important example of the Adelaide Hills Forest Environment’. Messmate and Brown Stingybark trees dominate the forest canopy.





On this occasion I chose as my operating location an area just inside the Park near the point marked 6 on the map. Travel down Evans Drive (from the Heathfield end), a gravel track, until you reach the park boundary on your right hand side and you will come to a gate. When turning from Scott Creek Road into Evans Drive the Park begins on the corner and is thus on your left hand side at the turn. Near point 6 is a better location for the amateur radio operator than just inside the main gate (where the dedication plaque can be found). Maps courtesy of the SA Government.

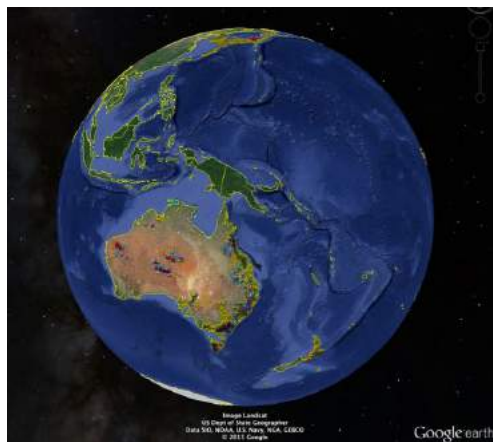
