The May 12 CRTC Public Hearing to consider license renewals for non-compliant stations has been rescheduled as an Electronic Hearing beginning June 16. The AM stations involved are listed below and were previously given short-term license renewals expiring Aug 31 for non-compliance.

+License Renewal in question based on station failing conditions of license: responding to CRTC requests; playing 30% Pop, 35% Canadian, 15% French vocals and 70% World music; filing music lists, annual returns and self-assessment reports.

100 Years Ago – in June 1920, a gramophone record of "Dardanella" was transmitted from Portage la Prairie MB and heard in Winnipeg by listeners gathered for a demonstration of Radio by Marconi wireless engineers. Stationed at Kelvin Technical school, the engineers were building the Wireless Telegraph station promised for Winnipeg in an April announcement.

75 Years Ago – on June 14 1945, plans were completed by Consulting Engineer HR McLaughlin for 1 KW CKSB-1250 St Boniface MB, the first French language radio station in Western Canada, with a two tower directional pattern to protect WREN and KFKU, which shared 1250 with 1 KW in Lawrence, KS.

50 Years Ago – on May 22 1970, the CRTC announced that, beginning in 1971, 30% of music played on AM stations must be Canadian, but the CBC opted

for 40% for its stations.

25 Years Ago – on June 25 1995, at the end of the 5:00 PM News, CFVR-850 Abbotsford BC became CKMA "85 Radio Max", playing Top 40 hits from 1955 to 1980. Expanded into an almost simulcast network in 1997 with CHWK Chilliwack and CKGO Hope, differences in the length of local announcements saw songs up to a minute apart between the stations.



DXpedition #11 – Marais Temps Clair Conservation Area, Black Walnut MO Eric Bueneman (NØUIH)

This DXpedition was delayed due to the COVID-19 pandemic; it is only a coincidence that I chose a night when there was civil unrest 20 miles away in downtown Saint Louis. The first DXpedition of 2020 brought me back to Marais Temps Clair Conservation area in the agricultural community of Black Walnut MO, in eastern Saint Charles County MO on the evening of June 1 2020 (UTC June 2). Temperatures were in the mid-70s Fahrenheit under partly cloudy skies, the perfect evening for a DXpedition.

Once again, I took my General Electric Superadio III for AM broadcast band DX; the Tropical Band DX was logged with a Tecsun PL-600 and a homebrew 30-foot longwire antenna. On the AM broadcast band, sunset conditions favored the Midwest and Mid-South, although a couple of Caribbean stations made it in after sunset around 2120 ELT (0120 UTC). The Tropical Bands had the usual stations from the Americas. I also brought my Whistler WS1040 handheld analog/digital VHF/UHF scanner to monitor police, fire and EMS radio traffic coming out of areas hit by civil unrest. I began monitoring around 2000 ELT (0000 UTC) and wrapped up around 2210 ELT (0210 UTC). Times for domestic DX are in ELT; Pan-American and Tropical Band logs are in UTC.

The loss of 1430 in Saint Louis allowed for me to log WCMY and WPLN. I'm most likely going to keep my DXpeditions confined to the Missouri side of the Mississippi River for some time to come. 73 and good DX from NØUIH, the Florissant Valley Dial Twister.

It had vanished April 4 after reliable groundwave reception day and night, and in nightly checks, no sign of it since until now. Classaxe.com says it was last logged 2020-04-02, 50 watts, 'Blaki'. I wonder if this have anything to do with the amount of traffic at that airport, or lack of it, in the interim.

USA. 281-MCW kHz, May 29 at 0622, ND beacon DMO - not Des MOines as I first guess, but SeDalia, MissOuri, 25 watts. Classaxe.com has something about it being shut down in February, decommissioned in April and last logged 2020-03-25. Not off any more.

USA. 475.09-CW kHz, May 31 at 0636, Dave Frantz has resumed his very slow Morse code beacon at WWRB Manchester TN, "WA4SZE COM

WA4SZE/BEACON". I tune past here almost every night, and last time heard was December 10 2019. {And as of June 7 not heard since}.

USA. 1270, June 2 at 2014, in full daytime conditions, KRXO Claremore (Tulsa) OK silly sports talk at 5 kW with heavy SAH of exactly 1 Hz from another ground-waver: got to be either 50 kW KFLC from Benbrook (Metroplex) TX with Spanish sports talk; or 5 kW KSCB Liberal KS talk/sport. KRXO and KFLC directional to complicate. Need to DF and/or pull a language. Which I undertake 24+ hours later, June 3 at 2039; on the same setup, R75 and E-W longwire, now the subaudible heterodyne is only 47/minute or 0.78 Hz, so one or both must vary over time. Then at 2045, I try the DX-398 portable outside, which has good sensitivity and nulling: The main SAH peaks ESE/WNW, i.e. Claremore and Liberal which are a few degrees from collinear, opposite directions thru Enid. At 2048, sensitivity and nulling: The main SAH peaks ESE/WNW, i.e. Claremore and Liberal which are a few degrees from collinear, opposite directions thru Enid. At 2048, I count the SAH at 50/minute = 0.83 Hz – really varying, or margin of error? But almost-nulling those, favoring SSW, I hear another weaker beat, of 154/minute = 2.57 Hz, and that has to be from KFLC in TX, against one of the others. Next at 2053 I try the NRD-545 with E-W mag-loop. This pulls in two audios, both English AFAICT, and the beat is 49/minute = 0.82 Hz. I cannot measure frequencies to fractions of Hz, but only "compare" those which are not zero-beat – and lax engineering of US stations insures that is: most of them. Two of these stations make mwoffsets list, only a year or two old: 1270 1269.9985 USA KRXO (Claremore OK) 2018-12-01 1270 1270.0006 USA KFLC (Fort Worth TX) 2019-01-03. That means the SAH between them would be 2.1 Hz, not too far from my current reading. Distances, city-to-Enid city: Claremore OK 203 km = 126 stml Liberal KS 281 km = 174 stml Benbrook TX 415 km = 258 stml Ground conductivity. is mostly 30 over this part of OK, the greatest to be found anywhere overland, maybe into 15 by BB TX. Tulsa itself may be 15, but only 8 in a small area west of Tulsa between us - 8 is the same poor figure as across the MO/AR Ozarks. Directionality: 5 kW KRXO favors ENE/WSW with minor lobe at right angle, but Enid appears to be close to a notch between them. 50 kW KFLC aims major lobe to the east but fairly broad with some daytime signal thisaway; 5 kW KSCB non-directional. This is an example of *pure DXing* as we have no interest whatsoever in these stations' stupid sportstalk programming, whatever the language. And no ionosphere required!

UnID. 1370, June 2 at 0559, I strain to make out a station slightly atop the graveyard-like jumble, and can almost imagine an ID as KGNO, and mention of FM 103.something? That Dodge City KS station cannot be heard on 5 kW ND day power as it used to be, at least at SR/SS, but night power, if any, probably running 24h is 230 watts. NRC AM Log does not show any FM for it, nor does own token website: https://www.swksradio.com/kgno-1370-am/ The Log does show a possible 1370 with FM 103.5, KAWL York NE with 176 ND watts night on 1370.

JSA. 1520, June 2 at 0605, KOKC OKC with equal level QRM, soon recognized as the KYND Cypress TX barker-for-business loop, despite being a 25 kW DAYTIMER. This has been going on for over a year, at least sporadically. Where's the FCC? KOKC must not even care to complain, as it does not care either to resume its licensed full power of 50 kW. Who cares about "clear channel 1520", with a translator on 95.3? 1540-, same time, a LAH here no doubt the off-frequency Houston-market neighbor KGBC Galveston TX; ditto, FCC. 1560, not hearing Vietnamese from usually dominant KGOW Bellaire TX; something changed there?

ÚSA. 1520, June 6 at 0538, the KYND Cypress TX barker can again be heard mixing with KOKC; how brazen – how futile. 25 kW daytimer with no business and no authority at night. 1540v, June 6 at 0539, LAH, of course from off-frequency-minus KGBC Galveston; last night I checked here, there was no het; intermittent. 1560, June 6 at 0540, bits of Vietnamese in the mix, i.e. KGOW Bellaire TX also in the Houston market, http://vietradio.com/ – beware, audio autolaunches without permission; but no longer dominant here on 1560. Perhaps have finally reverted to 15 kW licensed night pattern, totally SE into the Gulf. FCC AM Query shows a *nine*-tower directional array peaking at 145 degrees, https://transition.fcc.gov/Bureaus/MB/Databases/AM_DA_patterns/1325314-108410.pdf i.e. aiming for the Vietnamese communities upon oil platforms, Yucatán, Central America, across South America: Colombia/Ecuador, Iquitos, Bolivia, Paraguay/Uruguay borders with Argentina/RGS; vs plenty of other 1560s.

USA [and non]. WORLD OF RADIO 2035 monitoring: Also confirmed Sunday May 24 starting way late at 0357 on WA0RCR, 1860-AM, MO, vs storm noise

from IN/IL picked up by IN SDR.
USA. WORLD OF RADIO 2036 monitoring: Next nominal airing at 0315 Sunday on WA0RCR, 1860-AM, MO, much delayed due to open-ended durations of various preceding ham-shows: good signal at Indiana SDR, first check at 0302, TWIAR, and then Houston AMSAT; 0402 ARRL news; but WOR in progress at 0427 about 16 minutes into so must have started circa 0411.

USA [and non]. WORLD OF RADIO 2037 monitoring: Also confirmed at 0353 Sunday June 7 on WAORCR, 1860-AM, MO, noisy via Chicago SDR, at the midpoint so started circa 0339.

UnID. 2097.3, May 31 at 0619, single-letter beacon A is JBA in noise level, every dekasecond. Although a reliable source has assured us it is not heard as a local signal in Quartzsite AZ, I see in classaxe.com it is still placed in Quartzite [sic] with a period of 10.14 seconds, last logged by anyone there 2020-08-05. QZ is about 17 miles from the CA border on I-10.

BRAZIL. We have lost *so many* SW stations, especially from this huge country which not long ago had a thriving domestic SW scene. SW frequency pages the 2005 World Radio TV Handbook, only a sesquidecade ago. How many do you recognize or remember hearing? pages per hearing? MW ago. How many do which is really you MW, https://www.w4uvh.net/2005WRTHBrazil126.jpg {starting with 120mb, and top https://www.w4uvh.net/2005WRTHBrazil127.jpg

USA. 3215, May 26 at 0609, dead air except for some hum and always squeal from WWCR-1, instead of Brother Scare who continues unabated on 4840. This happens again and again; mis-programming of automation? as if I should care. One less frequency for nonsense, and more \$\$\$ down the drain.

USA. 4840, May 29 at 0614, S9+30/40 of dead air from WWCR instead of Brother Scare while he still rants on 3215; sometimes it's vice versa. 5935 remains on with DGS/PMS.

USA. 5890, June 1 at 0600, WWCR-4 is on not only with dead air but TOM modulation, //3215 while 4840 has something else although both supposed to be Overcomer "Ministry" or "Ministries", while correct word is "Ministry". WWCR website only shows transmitter sked expiring May 31, while June 1 is a normal changeover date, so maybe now 5890 intentionally on. Anyway the transmitter skeds covering 24 hours each are only what's *available*, (5890 at 02-12), not actual usage. For that we need to see the new June pdf program skeds; while May still shows nothing on 5890 except 02-04 Tuesday-Saturday non-TOM. (New skeds up June 3 show TOMBS almost 24/7 on WWCR-4}

BRAZIL. 4885, May 26 at 0606, JBA carrier. It's rather too early for the Korean clandestine to be propagating, and besides, Ron Howard reports it's on 4880 this week. 4885 overnight used to be a standout frequency for Rádio Clube do Pará, sometimes even with a SAH from the other ZY, always weaker Rdif. Acreana, Rio Branco, although WRTH 2020 shows them both not on the air 24 hours. So what is this signal now, Acreana, or Pará on reduced power? Aoki does show Pará Hio Branco, attnough WHTH 2020 shows them both not on the air 24 hours. So what is this signal now, Acreana, or Para on reduced power? Aoki does show Para 24 hours and Acreana off 0.400-0.900. On May 23, Eduard Korsakov in Moskva asked the DXLD yg, "Clube do Pará is off air on 4885 kHz (due to COVID-19?) for a while. Is it planned reactivation?" Not sure how he concluded it was off. So I have been checking Brasil KiwiSDRs as night approaches after 2030 May 26: Closest is the one at Boa Vista, 1434 km = 891 statute miles city-to-city, but the local on 4875 has terrible audio and wide splatter blocking 4885. Almost as close is the one at Caruaru, Pernambuco, 1581 km = 983 stmi, and on this one I do have a VP signal in Brazilian, which is surely Pará rather than Acreana, much further on the other side of Brazil — and besides, the KiwiSDR nearest that, in Vilhena has nothing but noise on 4885. Back on Caruaru, at 2059 reception is no better, sounds like an enthusiastic produced ID with music but I can't copy a single word for sure. Perhaps later hearage by this one will improve to confirm it's Pará even with a degraded signal? No, at 2157 there is still a carrier but no audio in the noise. At 2206 I try 4885 on the superior though further Pardinho SP SDR, 2405 km = 1495 stml due south in the dark, and now there is almost readable Brazilian talk, news, likely official hour on most/many stations, A Voz do Brasil without local IDs. By 0054 May 27 recheck, Pardinho has only a JBA carrier which could be Acreana if Pará now be off for the evening.

BRAZIL. 4885, following up my last report about monitoring for Radio Clube do Pará, Belém: May 27 at 0455 I am hearing a poor signal via Pardinho

KiwiSDR, during a talk/interview show and it matches a few seconds later the RCP webcast brought up via Streema – but the IDs after 0458 are for Rádio Bandeirantes, 840 et al, São Paulo! A station which had abandoned SW some years ago, 6090, 9645, 11925 which are no longer mentioned. Now it's available to other stations at least as an overnight network feed. 0459 IDs again only for it, not RCP, 2 am timecheck and news. The 4885 signal direct to here remains a JBA carrier, must be very low power. BTW, our condolences to those rational Brazilians who never supported ascension to power of the world's second-most-stupid

TAIWAN [non]. WRMI, 5010 //7780 //9395, May 30 at 0200 Radio Taiwán Internacional has resumed in Spanish, unlike the first time I checked, May 27, when FSR {anti-PRC Freedom Synergy Radio} usurped/used up all four frequencies at this hour. So which way is it supposed to be? WRMI websked has a hard time matching reality details, but it now shows FSR only at 0130 on 5800 and 9395; and no FSR at 0200, just Radio Taiwan, on 5010, 5800 [sic], 7780 and 9395. {More incidental 5010 mentions in my original reports}.

USA. 5050, Saturday May 23 at 2307, Jim Roland, PO Box in Tullahoma TN 37388 repeatedly spelling out this and website address. (How many other ways are there to spell Tullahoma?). S9+10/20, no ID, but certainly WWRB Manchester TN, active weekends only and belatedly for A-season ex 3215/3195; first reported last week by Bob Butterfield. Beware: pirates have also appeared on 5050, and WWRB has been known to fill with jazz.

USA. 5072.005 and 5097.993, May 23 at 0556, very weak parasitic spurs out of 5085 WTWW-2 with rock music still on at S9+40/50!, measured at slightly different offsets than before, which were approx. 12.9 kHz above and below, now much closer to 13.0. Did Ted touch them up?

USA. (5085), Sunday May 24 between 00 and 02, numerous spot-checks of WTWW-2 stream hear nothing but hamgab, TONITO no-show.

USA. 5085, Sunday May 31 at 0017, WTWW-2 with 'Theatre Organ [NOT] In The Ozarks', in progress, S9+30/40! but suppressed/distorted = suptorted modulation. Probably would be in good clear \$tereo on webcast, but not convenient to access. Last week this show never appeared during 2-hour window. 5085, WTWW-2 is on and arriving this early at 2140 much better with woman's voice not //15810-, presumably some ham show this Saturday. The other possible WTWW frequencies, 9930, 9475 and 5830 are all silent, and probably 12105 if I could have remembered it. By 0100 June 7, only 5085 heard with quotation from Exodus, ID and rock music, distorted on S9+30/40 signal.

USA. 5130, Wednesday June 3 at 0122, this WBCQ is on but JBA, presumably with W5KUB's 'Amateur Radio Roundtable' of Tuesday evenings. Simultaneously, 5085 WTWW-2 is loud but no QSO ham show, rather Ted hyping "Global Hot 100".
